## **CLUB COMPETITIONS (CONT)**

There are normally 4 'Club Days' during each season when everyone is welcomed to a day's bowling and a CANDLELIT evening session in September.

Teams representing the CAPTAIN versus the VICE CAPTAIN is the opening game of the season when the green is first open for play.

The MILES TRIPLES, a trophy donated by Mrs Miles in 1977.

Three wood triples, played as a two-league format. The skip for each triple is selected by the organiser, leads and twos are drawn by ballot. Points are awarded for a win (2) or draw (1); the number of ends won and shot difference are calculated to arrive at the finalists. The two league winners play the final.

The JASPER TROPHY, which is a silver candlestick, was donated by Mrs Beryl Wagner in memory of her husband David. The origin of the award dates back to the year 2000 when two club members

bowled for 24 hours to raise money for the club. David Wagner turned up at the green at around 2 a.m. dressed as Willie Winkee in dressing gown, slippers, nightcap and candlestick to complain—in

jest—about the noise.

The Skips are selected, leads and twos are drawn for each game. Each player keeps their own scorecard and points are awarded in each game to each of the players.

The ANNIVERSARY CUP was presented by Ms Avril Shead to celebrate the Clubs' diamond anniversary in 1998.

The MACKENZIE CUP & SHIELD. We also have a 'Derby' against Tongham. Way back in 1952 Colonel
